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Resolution 5H-2006

ADA House of Delegates 2006

- multifaceted resolution (Resolution 5H)
- targeted at vulnerable elderly issues
- UNANIMOUS acceptance



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Vulnerable Elderly: a definition

- Vulnerable elderly patients are patients over age 65 who have any or all of the following:
 - limited mobility,
 - limited resources, or
 - complex health status

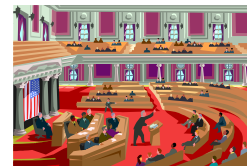
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Advocacy



Advocacy Goal - Vulnerable Elderly Resolution (5H)

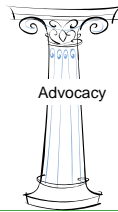
- Persuade legislators and regulators at all levels of government to make vulnerable elders' oral health a priority through increased funded legislation for:
 - Care
 - Education
 - Research

- Educate key senators and representatives on critical need for advanced education programs in geriatric dentistry

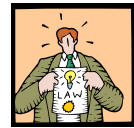


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Advocacy Strategy # 1 - Action

- *“Advocate for dental programs in Title VII of the Public Health Service Act that provide training to enhance the oral health care of older adults and adults with disabilities..”*

Included in Health Care Reform bills

- *Special Care Dentistry Act of 2009*
 - *Mandates age, blind and disabled as covered populations under Medicaid*
 - *Health Care Reform has made any expansion of adult Medicaid unlikely*



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

- Build and transfer the knowledge base needed to improve the oral health of vulnerable elders by generating, funding and supporting studies



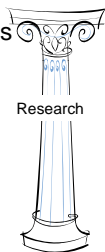

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5H Research Goals: a specific initiative

- Oral Health Care of Vulnerable Elderly Patients survey
 - Published February 2009
 - 1,582 dentists in U.S. practice settings
 - Available on www.ada.org



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Oral Health Care of Vulnerable Elderly survey (Highlights)

- 92.6% dentists in private practice provided oral health care to vulnerable elderly patients in 2007.
- 33.5% indicated that vulnerable elderly patients had a problem obtaining dental care in their community.
- 38.6% of established dentists and 25.3% of new dentists were 'very comfortable' treating vulnerable elderly patients.



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Oral Health Care of Vulnerable Elderly survey (Highlights)

- For those dentists not providing dental services to vulnerable elders, the main reason was because "they preferred not to".
- Over half of VE patients (56.6%) were not covered by insurance
- Dentists felt the biggest barrier to VE patients receiving dental care was "inability to pay for services"



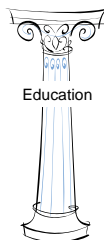

Education Strategy # 1

- Develop educational strategies: address geriatric dentistry training opportunities



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Education Strategy # 1: Accreditation

- Develop educational strategies: address geriatric dentistry training opportunities
- Work with Commission on Dental Accreditation
- Add vulnerable elderly language to Special Needs patient definition
- Provided language for accreditation guidelines for predoctoral and specialty training
- Clinical experience as well as didactic



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Education Strategy # 1 – Modified definition

- “Patients with special needs: Those patients whose medical, physical, psychological, *cognitive* or social situations make it necessary to modify normal dental routines in order to provide dental treatment for that individual. These individuals include, but are not limited to, people with developmental disabilities, *cognitive impairment*, complex medical problems, significant physical limitations, *and older adults*.”

*Recommendations accepted July 2009 by
Predoctoral Dental Education Review Committee and Commission
Currently in open hearing period*
